MARINE BOARD (DECLARATION OF SPEED LIMITS FOR BOATS)
(MARINERS) AMENDMENT NOTICE 2022

The Minister responsible for marine and ports services, in exercise of the power conferred by section 10(1)(a) of the Marine Board Act 1962, issues the following Notice:

Citation

1 This Notice, which amends the Marine Board (Declaration of Speed Limits for Boats) (Mariners) Notice 2001 (“the principal Notice”), may be cited as the Marine Board (Declaration of Speed Limits for Boats) (Mariners) Amendment Notice 2022.

Amends paragraph 3

2 Paragraph 3(1) of the principal Notice is amended by deleting all the words and substituting “For the purposes of Ferry Reach, a person navigating a boat within 100 metres of the shoreline shall not exceed 15 nautical miles per hour.”

Revokes paragraph 3A

3 Paragraph 3A of the principal Notice is revoked.

Inserts paragraphs 5A, 5B and 5C

4 The principal Notice is amended by inserting the following after paragraph 5—

“Speed limits not applicable in an emergency

5A Paragraphs 2 and 3 do not apply to boats responding to an emergency.

Boatmen to exercise caution

5B Notwithstanding paragraphs 2, 3 and 5, all mariners, pilots and boatmen must exercise extreme caution at all times, especially when approaching other boats.

Offence

5C It is an offence under section 10(3) of the Marine Board Act 1962 for the master of a ship or boat to fail to observe the requirements of this Notice, punishable on summary conviction in accordance with section 112 of that Act.”.
